## DELAYED LETTER TO THE EDITOR AND APOLOGY

Back in February of this year, we received a letter to the editor from Edward M. Cramer of New York, NY. He brought to our attention a serious error in an article that ran in the January issue. We did not intend to ignore the letter, and our sincerest apologies to Mr. Cramer for not attending to it on a timely basis. The text of his letter follows:

Dear Mr. Dean,

The article in the January 2006 issue of "Intellectual Property Today" entitled "Intellectual Property Strategies to Fuel the Hydrogen Revolution" contains a serious error.

In the section on Copyrights the authors state that copyrights are "valid for the authors' lifetime plus 50 years". Almost eight years ago the Act was amended to change 50 years to 70 years – a major change.

The constitutionality of the extension was upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Eldred v. Ascroft* (Sct 2003) 537 U.S. 186.
